



- 30,000 sq ft
- Construction
  completion June 2017

Clatsop Community College Patriot Hall

- Redevelopment of historic building:
  - Passive strategies
    - Natural ventilation
    - Daylighting
- Solar thermal radiant heating
- High-efficiency envelope



Clatsop Community College Patriot Hall (cont.)

- Energy Trust incentives: \$57,400
- Estimated annual savings: 134,060 kWh and 14,640 therms
- Estimated annual utility cost savings: \$21,087

# Yellowhawk Tribal Health Center

- New health center serving the Confederated Tribes of Umatilla Indian Reservation
- Passive strategies
  - Daylighting
- VRF system
- Upgraded building envelope
- Reduced Lighting Power
  Density



# Yellowhawk Tribal Health Center (cont.)

- Energy Trust incentives: \$296,200
- Estimated annual savings: 646,840 kWh
- Estimated annual utility cost savings: \$48,400
