Board Orientation Minutes—203rd Meeting

October 11, 2022

New Board of Director Orientation Session #2

Henry Lorenzen called the meeting to order at 9:08 and explained the format of the meeting and the agenda and the plans for the remainder of the day, including a DEI workshop, tour of a PGE operations center, and a board dinner.

Organizational Structure

Michael Colgrove, Executive Director, opened the presentations and explained the purpose of this Orientation Session #2, which focuses on Energy Trust's internal operations. Mike explained our organization chart to give directors of Energy Trust's high level structure.

Tracy Scott, Director of Programs, presented an overview of the programs and program staff.

Residential Programs

Thad Roth, Residential Sector Lead, presented an outline of the Residential program, who is served, how we serve customers, program structure, measures, and overall program strategy.

Commercial Programs

Oliver Kesting, Commercial Programs Sector Lead, presented information on the commercial programs: Existing Buildings, New Buildings, and Business Lighting. Oliver described the various measures and program offerings such as energy modeling, building efficienc, equipment commissioning, trade ally offerings, direct install programs, and others.

Oliver discussed the new activities in the programs, including the plans for the business lighting program redesign plans, which will also be covered by Amanda Potter in her presentation on the Industrial and Agricultural programs. Oliver also described challenges with electric savings and cost trends.

Industrial and Agricultural Programs

Amanda Potter, Industrial and Agricultural Sector Lead, presented information on the Industrial and Agricultural program, explaining the Standard Track, Custom Track, Strategic Energy Management, and Lighting Track. Amanda also described the change in the program management and delivery model, with a program management contractor for all of the program tracks. Amanda also described the new efforts for expanding outreach of the program, with a DEI council and more and more diverse subcontractors to deliver the program.

Amanda described challenges for the program ahead: uncertain market conditions, lighting savings, adding in gas transport customers, and working to outreach for more and more diverse customers.

Board members asked questions about the programs and about the impact of gas transport.

Renewable Programs

Betsy Kauffman described the program, including the new focus on distribution system connect technologies, which are batters and smart inverters and support grid system resilience and flexibility. In addition, the program is now required to spend at least of 25% of funds collected to benefit customers with low and moderate incomes. Betsy described the way in which the program funds the above-market cost of renewable projects and measures, except with respect to distribution system connected technologies for which more than above market cost can be provided.

Betsy described the portfolio of offerings in terms of technologies (Solar and Other Renewables, which include biopower and hydropower technologies) and project development assistance. Betsy provided a detailed description of the Irrigation Modernization Program, explaining how the generation possibilities that occur from the piping of the water.

Betsy then provided an overview of the Solar program, which include information on the residential and business installations as well as other programs funded by NREL grants, like the Solar Ambassador program.

The board took a break at 10:35 a.m. and reconvened at 10:50

Organizational Process-Support Teams

Business Planning and Budget Development

Melanie Bissonnette presented information on the annual process of business planning and budget development. Melanie explained the reasons for business planning, the budget development and approval process, and the budget binder information.

Board members asked questions about the board involvement in the development process.

Measure Development and Cost Effectiveness

Jake Kennedy and Alex Novie presented information to the board on how we determine cost effectiveness of measures. Jake gave a quick overview on cost effectiveness, and Alex provided information on the measure development process.

Board members asked a number of questions about how cost-effectiveness is calculated in different areas of the state and for things that have significant impact. Fred Gordon and other staff provided information to board members regarding the way in which Energy Trust works with the OPUC on exceptions and developing works.

Integrated Resource Planning

Spencer Moersfelder presented information to the board on Integrated Resource Planning (IRP). IRP is the process by which the utilities can plan for future usage, so that utilities can plan strategically on both supply side and demand side resources. Energy Trust's energy efficiency work is an important demand side resource. Energy Trust contributes to the resource assessment for IRP by calculating technical, achievable, and cost-effective achievable energy efficiency potential so that utility can use that information in calculating their resource potential for IRP. The IRP, therefore, are important to the savings goals and revenue negotiations with utilities.

In addition, IRP and resource assessment are used for strategic planning and program planning. IRP is a model, so Energy Trust must continue to monitor real time signals to inform our work.

Board members had a number of questions to help inform allocation of our resources. Utilities look at the annual savings levels, and they are less concerned about where those savings are coming from.

They are more focused now on distribution system planning, so Spencer thinks there will be ongoing thinking on how this process can be involved in that to do projects where load demands will guide the work with utilities and their needs. Targeted load reduction will continue to be key, regardless of which sector.

Mike noted that these are all building blocks in our budget development process. Steve Lacey will talk about our revenue analysis as part of the budget process, and this should bring these building blocks together.

Determination of Revenue

Steve Lacey provided information to the board on how the utility funding process comes about. Steve described the statutory and regulatory sources of Energy Trust revenues. Steve also explained how we use revenue and reserves negotiations in our budget development over several years. This informs utility rate and tariff planning.

Mike then turned it over to the more wraparound services.

Marketing and Outreach

Sue Fletcher and Sloan Schang provided information on the brand marketing and outreach functions of the organization. Outreach staff are uniquely familiar with the communities serve, both geographically and community based. Brand marketing is to provide support to outreach team, develop effective advertising, and advance public relations for Energy Trust.

Communications and Reporting

Julianne Thacher provided more detail on public relations. Julianne did a brief description of PR work with media and noted that there will be a larger communications training for board members in 2023.

Julianne then explained our reporting function, our official record of our results. We are required by our OPUC Grant Agreement to do regular reporting, and Julianne showed examples of some of the reports we do.

Policy Services and Stakeholder Relations

Hannah Cruz described Energy Trust's Policy Services team's work to track Oregon law, federal law, other external policies that can impact our work. All of this is to inform or strategic plan and direction. Hannah noted that we do all of this without lobbying, which is prohibited by our OPUC Grant Agreement. Hannah also described how we provide information to legislators on Energy Trust trade allies as well as benefits and savings delivered to their area.

Board Polices Process

Debbie Menashe presented information on board-level policies and the work of the Nominating & Governance Committee.

Business Meeting

Henry Lorenzen called the meeting to order at approximately 9:03 a.m. Henry reminded board members that consent agenda items can be changed to regular agenda items at any time. There were no requests to move items from the consent agenda.

General Public Comments

There were no public comments.

President's Welcome and Workshop Introduction of Angie Thomson, Budget Workshop Facilitator

Henry welcomed the board to the budget workshop and introduced Angie Thomson of Thomson Strategic Consulting who facilitated the board's workshop discussion.

2023 Draft Budget and 2023-2024 Action Plans Workshop

Energy Trust staff presented the draft 2023-2024 budget to the board for board discussion and consideration.

Executive Director Michael Colgrove opened the presentation by reviewing the inputs and dynamics that shape the draft budget: laws and regulation, utility planning, cost-effective energy efficiency, above-market cost for renewable generation, and market intelligence. Stakeholder engagements also identified the following dynamics for this budget: market conditions (inflation and workforce and supply chain challenges), climate change policies at federal, state, county, and municipal levels, focus on relieving energy burden, and community engagement, with focus on diversity, equity and inclusion.

Angie prompted board discussion with several questions, and board members asked questions about the dynamics and factors and specific provisions of the budget.

After a brief break, Michael Colgrove continued with information about the specifics of the 2023-2024 draft budget and action plan. The budget does not anticipate rate increases for utility customers, with forecasted 2022 carryover to be deployed into the 2023-2024 budget. He noted that the draft budget reflects a shift from a longer term savings approach to an approach that aims to get savings faster even if it is more costly. While still cost effective, this approach may result in increased levelized cost to meet current policy and market dynamics. To do this, the budget also reflects a staffing plan that builds future capacity to design new incentives, develop new program designs and offers, build new systems and work with utilities and stakeholders and communities in new ways.

Board members engaged in a detailed discussion regarding the draft budget, asking questions regarding, among other things, potential state policy changes, staffing, costs, success metrics, equity, and specific new program designs and offers, including work with small businesses and pilots for small hybrid heat pump HVAC systems.

Mike and Angie thanked board members for their attention and discussion.

General Public Comments

There were no general public comments.

President's Report

President Henry Lorenzen recognized Board Member Silvia Tanner for her upcoming honor at the Citizen Utility Board conference on Friday October 14. Silvia will be recognized for her work as a community activist to advance clean energy for all. The board congratulated her, and Silvia thanked the board.

Utility and Public Comment on Draft 2023 Budget and 2023-2024 Action Plan

Laney Ralph, Northwest Natural Gas Company (NWN)

Laney expressed thanks for the increased coordination with the utilities through the budget development process, and she acknowledged that this coordination requires extra work of staff. Laney stressed that notwithstanding state policy, NWN has its own organizational decarbonization goals and looks forward to working with Energy Trust to reach these goals with an eye to expanding service to transport customers and pilot program offerings such as hybrid heat pump system incentive offerings. She specifically expressed support for the draft budget's proposed innovation team and outreach to customers who we haven't served.

Monica Cowlishaw, Cascade Natural Gas (Cascade)

Monica echoed Laney Ralph's comments and appreciation for the increased collaboration through the budget development process. Like NWN, Cascade has organizational decarbonization goals and looks forward to similar expanded work with Energy Trust to achieve those goals.

Jake Wise, Portland General Electric (PGE)

Jake also expressed appreciation for greater collaboration throughout the budget development process. He also thanked board members for visiting the PGE operations center. These types of engagements bring additional awareness to the value of the work of Energy Trust and PGE. In addition, Jake mentioned PGE's continuing interest and support of working with Energy Trust in expanded efforts like targeted load management and other non-wires solutions. PGE also supports the 2023-2024 draft budget for additional Energy Trust staff and for efforts to reach communities not yet served by Energy Trust's programs.

Lisa McGarity, Avista

Lisa described how Energy Trust is an integral part of Avista's decarbonization goals. Reducing consumption through energy efficiency programs delivery through Energy Trust. Lisa expressed Avista's general support of the draft budget, noting that Avista wants to make sure that Energy Trust's board and leadership continue to focus on Energy Trust's core mission for energy efficiency acquisition, particularly in the event of an economic recession. She also expressed Avista's support for staffing at levels that support good work-life balance.

Kari Greer, Pacific Power (PAC)

Kari also expressed appreciation for the new collaboration on budget development, mentioned specifically the development of utility specific action plans. Kari also expressed appreciation for stable utility customer costs as reflected in the draft budget. PAC does have some concerns about the increase in staff budget, asking questions about the timing of bringing on additional staff. Michael Colgrove responded that the revised draft budget is expected to include a phased approach to hiring based on comments like this from utilities and the OPUC.

Committee Reports

Compensation & Human Resources Committee

Energy Trust Director of Human Resources Amanda Sales summarized board packet notes from the committee's August meeting at which representatives of the Principal and Cable Hill Partners presented performance information on the Energy Trust 401k plan.

Finance & Audit Committee

Chief Financial Officer Chris Dunning, staff liaison to the Finance & Audit Committee, presented highlights of the financial reports included in the board packet, with focus Energy Trust's compliance with the staffing metric for 2022. As a result of discussion with OPUC staff and staffing conditions, the OPUC has waived compliance with the staffing metric for 2022 and will permit Energy Trust to expend its 2022 staffing budget fully for hiring and retention

Chris also described the committee's discussion of staff's recommendation to extend a program delivery contract with CLEAResult for the Business Lighting program through December 2024. Amanda Potter, Industrial and Agriculture Sector Lead presented information to the board on the recommendation, noting that the Finance & Audit Committee recommended the extension. The board did not object. Staff is therefore authorized to negotiate an extension to the contract.

Chris then described the committee's discussion of staff's recommendation to extend the Existing Buildings program management contract with TRC Consulting. Senior Program Manager Wendy Gibson presented information to the board on the recommendation, noting that the Finance & Audit Committee recommended the extension. The board did not object. Staff is therefore authorized to negotiate an extension to the contract.

Nomination & Governance Committee

Debbie Menashe, Director of Legal Services and staff liaison to the Nominating & Governance Committee summarized the discussions of the committee as reflected board packet notes. The committee recommended certain amendments to the organizational Bylaws and Operating Guidelines of each of the Nominating & Governance Committee, Finance & Audit Committee, and Compensation & Human Resources Committees to reflect committee discussions on committee decision making processes. President Henry Lorenzen requested that the discussion on this recommendation be postponed to the next board meeting so that Nominating & Governance Committee chair Roland Risser could be present. The matter will be postponed until the December meeting.

Ad hoc Diversity Equity and Inclusion Committee

Melissa Cribbins, chair of the Ad hoc Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion Committee described the recent work of the committee, noting that the committee is meeting monthly for an hour. Melissa also previewed that the committee's charter sunsets at the end of 2022; the board will have to decide whether to continue it in 2023 and the committee will return at the next meeting with a recommendation.

Nominating & Governance Committee

Committee Chair Roland Risser provided a summary of the interview process and the Committee's recommendation to approve Ellen Zuckerman.

Roland Risser made a motion to approve Ellen Zuckerman and Anne Root seconded the motion. There was no further discussion and the Board members in attendance unanimously voted to approve Resolution #990 electing Ellen Zuckerman to the Board of Directors. Board members also expressed thanks to Alexia Kelly for her board service.

RESOLUTION R990 ELECTING TO ELLEN ZUCKERMAN TO THE ENERGY TRUST BOARD OF DIRECTORS

WHEREAS:

- Director Alexia Kelley notified the board of her intent to resign her position as a member of Energy Trust's board of directors effective at such time as her replacement is selected; her term was a three-year term which would have expired in February 2025;
- 2. The board of directors' Nominating & Governance Committee has completed a search process to fill the vacancy left by Director Kelley's resignation;

- 4. The Energy Trust board of directors reviewed the recommendation and nomination by the Nomination & Governance Committee and concurs with the committee recommendation to elect Ellen Zuckerman to fill the remaining term vacated by Director Kelly's resignation.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Energy Trust of Oregon, Inc. board of directors' elects Ellen Zuckerman to a term of office that ends not later than the board of directors 2025 annual meeting.

Summary

To Adopt 2023 Budget, 2024 Projection and 2023-2024 Action Plan.

Background

- The Energy Trust grant agreement with the Oregon Public Utility Commission requires Energy
 Trust to update its two-year action plan annually and describe the activities the organization will
 undertake to accomplish over the coming two years. In addition, HB 3141 legislation requires
 Energy Trust to work with each funding utility to develop utility specific budgets and action plans.
- This update occurs each year in connection with the preparation and finalization of the following year's budget.
- The 2023-2024 Action Plan outlines activities Energy Trust will undertake in 2023 and 2024 to achieve its strategic and annual goals and includes utility specific action plans.
- This 2023 Annual Budget and 2023-2024 Action Plan reflect revenues, expenditures and activities for all funding sources jointly developed with each funding utility as applicable

Discussion

- The Draft 2023 Annual Budget and 2024 Projections (the draft budget) and the Draft 2023-2024 Action Plan (the action plan) were presented to and discussed by the board and stakeholders at the public budget workshop held October 12, 2022.
- The draft budget and action plan were each posted on the Energy Trust website on October 5, 2022. Recordings of Executive Director Michael Colgrove's budget workshop presentation and breakout sessions were posted on Energy Trust's website on October 17, 2022.
- The Finance & Audit Committee reviewed the draft budget on September 26, 2022.
- Energy Trust and each partner utility sought input from the Conservation and Renewable Energy Advisory Councils on in-progress utility-specific action plans as part of new requirements to jointly develop utility-specific activities, budgets and agreements. All three advisory councils met on October 21, 2022 to review and discuss our draft 2023 organizational goals and how council input from earlier in the process was incorporated into our 2023-2024 budget and action plan.
- Oregon Public Utility Commission staff was briefed on the draft budget and action plan on September 16, 2022.
- OPUC commissioners hosted a public workshop on November 3, 2022 where the draft budget and action plan were presented and discussed.
- Portland General Electric, Pacific Power, NW Natural, Cascade Natural Gas and Avista were engaged by Energy Trust in budget concept development starting in June. Utility representatives reviewed and discussed draft budget and action plan information through subsequent individual coordination meetings and through their representatives' attendance at Conservation and Renewable Energy Advisory Council presentations in September and October.
- Public comments were due October 19, 2022 and were received from the Oregon Public Utility Commission, all five partner utilities, and a group of 15 environmental, climate and social justice organizations jointly submitting content.
- The board heard public comment and discussed the final proposed budget and action plan at its meeting on December 16, 2022.

Recommendation

Staff recommends adoption of the Energy Trust 2023 Final Proposed Budget, 2024 Projection and 2023-2024 Action Plan.

Erik Andersson called the meeting to order at 10:37am

Retirement Plan Update

Ryan Christiansen from Cable Hill Partners gave an overview of the 2022 Q3 economic and market picture. Ryan noted that U.S. equity, international equity, fixed income and bonds investments are all in negative territory. The Energy Trust plan investments are diversified, and Cable Hill monitors results against its scorecard. As a result of this monitoring, Ryan reminded the committee that one of the Energy Trust 401k plan funds, American Funds Washington Mutual, was removed and replaced with Schwab S&P 500 indexIn October. Ryan also noted that one additional fund, American Funds Europacific Growth, is on watch for its first quarter, but no funds up for removal at this time.

Ryan then provided a summary of the plan allocation by investment type. As of 09/30/2022 plan assets totaled \$18,315,970.01, with 19.1% in cash alternatives, 13.5% % in fixed income instruments, 16.0% in international/global equity, and 51.4% in U.S. equities. Ryan presented a potential new option in a Collective Investment Trusts (CITs), there was a brief discussion and followed by questions from the committee about CITs. Cable Hill will present more information at a future meeting.

Nicolas Running of The Principal reported on the Energy Trust retirement plan health, referencing a number of metrics including those regarding participation, contribution, diversification, and average deferral rate. On all dimensions, Energy Trust's plan is very healthy, with an overall health score of over 40.4%, the same as last quarter. The more typical plan health score is 17.3%. The committee discussed encouraging new Energy Trust employees to attend educational sessions on retirement readiness. Staff appreciated the discussion and will connect new hires with The Principal as part of the onboarding process.

Nicolas Running then reported to the committee on The Principal's plan recordkeeping services fees, noting that Energy Trust's record-keeping fees are relatively low compared to market. In addition, Energy Trust covers these fees for plan participants which is a very good benefit compared to similar plans.

Cable Hill, Principal, and Michael Colgrove exited the meeting at 11:15am.

Energy Trust Director of Human Resources, Amanda Sales, reported to the committee on market information on compensation. As recommended by the committee and the Oregon Public Utility Commission, staff monitors compensation levels against market information and reports results to the committee.

Adjourn meeting

Erik Andersson adjourned the meeting at approximately 11:35 a.m.

Overall, revenue is above budget by 2% for the year and 20% for the current month.

PAC discovered some energy service suppliers had failed to remit PPC funds collected in prior years, resulting in a large unanticipated catch-up payment in April (\$1.2M for efficiency, \$300k for renewables).

The NWN variance is due to how payments on the NWN Geo TLM funding were applied upon receipt in 2021. In lieu of having detailed payment statements from NWN, the NWN Geo TLM funding payments were erroneously applied to the general NWN funding source, with the applied correction in 2022 causing the YTD actual to appear below budget. NWN Industrial payments received to-date are aligned with payment timing detailed in the funding agreement.

For PGE Renewables and Cascade, cooler temperatures resulted in higher revenues early in the year but the effect has since moderated. Additionally, PGE Renewables had a 4% rate increase in January and another 3.6% rate increase in June.

PGE Storage has been impacted by supply chain constraints, which have slowed incentive payments. Additional variance for this and other smaller projects are due to invoice timing.

Additionally, market forces like supply chain issues and cost increases, as well as lingering impacts from 2021 budget mitigation plans, have collectively impacted the incentive pipeline, pushing incentive payment projections later into 2022.

The two OPUC financial performance measures deal with administrative and program support (as defined by OPUC) and staffing costs (employee salaries and fringe benefits).

The administrative and program support costs under OPUC oversight are at 6.7% of revenue, within the 8% of revenue cap, and at a 16% increase over the prior year. Administrative costs in the first half of 2021 were lower than average due to reduced marketing activity, vacant positions, and vacation balance utilization, causing the comparison to be so dramatic. Additionally, a general awareness campaign took place in the first half of this year, front loading expenses that will not continue into the remainder of the year.

Staffing costs under OPUC oversite are 8.4% higher than 2021, within the 9% increase cap.







Overall, revenue is above budget by 3% for the year and 13% for the current month.

PAC discovered some energy service suppliers had failed to remit PPC funds collected in prior years, resulting in a large unanticipated catch-up payment in April (\$1.2M for efficiency, \$300k for renewables).

The NWN variance is due to how payments on the NWN Geo TLM funding were applied upon receipt in 2021. In lieu of having detailed payment statements from NWN, the NWN Geo TLM funding payments were erroneously applied to the general NWN funding source, with the applied correction in 2022 causing the YTD actual to appear below budget. NWN Industrial payments received to-date are aligned with payment timing detailed in the funding agreement.

The NWN WA variance is due to projected payment timing. The payment received in October was projected to be received in November.

For PGE Renewables and Cascade, cooler temperatures resulted in higher revenues early in the year but the effect has since moderated. Additionally, PGE Renewables had a 4% rate increase in January and another 3.6% rate increase in June.

PGE Smart Battery has been impacted by supply chain constraints, which have slowed incentive payments. Additional variance for this and other smaller projects are due to invoice timing.

Some variance is due to timing - the beginning of 2021 saw unusually high incentive spending in relation to the full year and the 2022 incentive payment timing assumptions were based on these trends, which did not repeat. Additionally, market forces like supply chain issues and cost increases, as well as lingering impacts from 2021 budget mitigation plans, have collectively impacted the incentive pipeline, pushing incentive payment projections later into 2022 and early 2023.

The two OPUC financial performance measures deal with administrative and program support (as defined by OPUC) and staffing costs (employee salaries and fringe benefits).

The administrative and program support costs under OPUC oversight are at 6.8% of revenue, within the 8% of revenue cap, and at a 16.6% increase over the prior year. Administrative costs in the first half of 2021 were lower than average due to reduced marketing activity, vacant positions, and vacation balance utilization, causing the comparison to be so dramatic. Additionally, a general awareness campaign took place in the first half of this year, front loading expenses that will not continue into the remainder of the year.

Staffing costs under OPUC oversite are 8.4% higher than 2021, within the 9% increase cap.

Chair Susan Brodahl opened the meeting at approximately 2:00 and mentioned Silvia Tanner had to step out of the meeting early and that she had a hard stop at 3:45 and would like to change up the agenda and begin with the New/Emerging Inputs and asked Chris to lead the committee through the agenda.

2023 Budget Update

The committee had questions on stakeholder budget comments regarding the level of staffing changes and strategies being reflected in the budget. Staff provided context of the enhanced budget discussions with stakeholders and explained Energy Trust's need for additional staff due to high levels of staff turnover and increasing workload arising out of new responsibilities and obligations under HB 3141 and OPUC / utility expectations. In addition, staff explained the workload impact of COVID and the historic limits on staffing levels leading up to this budget.

Staff then provided a detailed explanation of staffing decisions and strategies being adjusted in the 2022 business plan and over a two to three-year period to rebuild and support staffing needs and retention.

Committee discussion followed, principally involving the level of board engagement in Energy Trust's staffing strategy and related budgetary impacts. Various perspectives were shared relating to timing of board involvement, the role of the Finance & Audit Committee in these matters, the merits of and risks addressed by Energy Trust's staffing strategy, and the outlook for additional demands on Energy Trust via potential legislation.

New Funding Opportunity Procedure (Mike Colgrove, Lizzie Rubado, Mark Wyman)

Susan opened the discussion asking for clarification of the committee engagement points based on opportunity level for feedback from the committee as we move through this process in the future.

Committee members then had a detailed discussion around the clarification of the protocol or need for a board policy of new funding opportunities. Committee members and staff discussed thoughts on engagement points for the board committee and the full board on these matters.

Staff provided additional background and context of why and how the protocol was established, which was to increase board awareness of staff's intent to consider and pursue new funding opportunities and to identify engagement points for the board. As Energy Trust's new funding opportunities work is maturing, staff seeks to clarify the protocol for greater efficiency and responsiveness to opportunities.

Committee discussion followed, focused on the level of Committee and Board oversight appropriate for new funding opportunities. The role of the Nominating & Governance Committee in this area was also discussed.

Susan requested that staff revise the protocol document to clarify processes and then route to the committee via email. She also requested a summary staff support and for discussion at the next board meeting during the committee report.

Financial Briefing (Chris Dunning, Tracy Scott)

Susan had to step out of the meeting at 3:45 p.m. and asked Chris to provide a written summary and overview of the Q3 energy and incentives forecast that highlight high level themes via email for the committee to review. Chris sent the requested information via email on Friday October 28th.

Chris mentioned the upcoming discussions on the Contract Execution Policy, which is under review by this committee and the Nominating and Governance Committee. Any revisions to this policy could arise out of discussions on new funding protocol discussions. The committee will return to this policy discussion at a later meeting. Mike also noted for the committee that the board's Net Assets Policy may also be implicated by the new funding protocols discussion.

Tracy then provided an overview of the third quarter energy and incentives forecast trends, which are shifting as a result of COVID and supply chain and labor impacts across Energy Trust's service territory. The committee requested copies of the slides covered and asked if the draft flash report would be made available to the committee in the future. These slides were included in the email sent by Chris on October 28th.

At Susan Brodahl's request Chris Dunning opened the meeting at approximately 2:04 with an overview of the agenda.

Budget Update (Staff reports)

Q3 forecast review (Amanda Potter, Cameron Mathews)

Chris provided an overview of the changes in the Q3 forecast. Amanda Potter standing in for Tracy Scott provided the deeper look at the drivers behind the change between Q2 to Q3. Labor shortages and supply chain issues continued to be the top two drivers and have continued to impact across all the programs. ETO continued to see an increase in projects dropping off. Staff and committee members discussed the strategies being deployed to respond to the market drivers across the funding sources.

Karen asked if there was an explanation for why PAC expenses were decreasing more from R1 to R2 than PGE's were. Amanda shared from a quick review PGE has a much bigger drop of lighting savings than Pacific power and lighting is generally more cost-effective savings.

Steve provided a clarification that there are two funding streams from Northwest Natural. One is the Public Purpose Charge (PPC), and the second is Demand Side Management (DSM). The second stream is Industrial DSM as it includes large commercial and industrial customers that have a separate funding stream. He noted that we account for those funding streams separately. Amanda shared that similar labor shortages and supply chain issues are causing decreases in Avista and Cascade Natural Gas and programs and staff is responding with adding additional outreach in those areas.

Chris shared the Oregon Public Utility Commission's approval to utilize the 2022 staff budget without constraint of the administrative or staffing year-over-year cost metrics.

R2 budget review and utility funding meeting outcomes (Steve Lacey, Amanda Potter)

Steve provided an update on final discussions with all utility funding partners, with the exception of PAC which was scheduled for the following day. He shared a detailed analysis of net asset reserves and forecast to end of 2024, answering the committee's clarifying questions.

Board Budget workshop and Advisory Council combined meeting recap (Amber Cole) **Public comment summary** (Amber Cole)

Amber Cole provided a high-level summary of the public comments received and answers provided. She shared the key takeaways from the board budget workshop and that overall the board members valued the change in format and would like additional time for discussion next year. She shared the Oregon Public Utility Commission's Staff Report and their overall support for the 2023 Budget and Action Plans, their acknowledgment of Energy Trust's need for stabilizing staffing and appreciated the efforts to spread the costs over multiple years.

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Briefing and Decision Paper Authorize a Contract for Media Buying and Creative Marketing Services

December 16, 2022

Summary

Staff recommends that the Board approve a professional services contract for Grady Britton, a full-service marketing firm located in Portland, to provide creative marketing services and advertising and media buying services for traditional and digital advertising on behalf of Energy Trust.

The contract term would begin January 1, 2023, and be for two years, with one optional one-year extension that will be brought to the Board for review and approval prior to the 2025 contract year. A scope of work for the contract is approved on an annual basis, subject to annual budgets and savings goals. The total contract amount for both 2023 and 2024 will be \$3,078,000. The yearly breakdown of the budget will be \$1.539 million total each year and will be consistent with the board approved budget for the organization. The structure of media buying services contracts is such that a portion of the total contract amount will be retained by Grady Britton for their service, with most of the authorized contract amount passed through directly to media outlets and other providers on Energy Trust's behalf. Staff proposes a contract budget of \$360,680 for Grady Britton services each year and \$1,178,320 for pass through media expenses. The two-year total for Grady Britton services would be \$721,360, with \$2,356,640 passing through to local media outlets.

Background: Advertising at Energy Trust

- Advertising is a critical aspect of brand and program integrated marketing strategies
 to raise awareness of Energy Trust among communities, customers and
 stakeholders and to drive participation in our programs and services. We leverage a
 full array of traditional and digital advertising as well as targeted outreach activities
 to reach the following audiences:
 - Residential customers eligible for energy efficiency and solar programs (includes renters and homeowners in manufactured homes, apartments, condos and single-family homes), with a focus on customers Energy Trust has previously underserved (communities of color, Spanish speaking customers, customers with low incomes and rural communities)
 - Business customers eligible for energy efficiency and solar programs (includes multifamily property managers and owners, small, medium and large commercial and industrial businesses, commercial developers, nonprofit organizations, government agencies, farms and wood products) with a focus on customers Energy Trust has previously underserved (communities of color, Spanish speaking customers, customers with low incomes and rural communities)

- Stakeholders (includes peer organizations, community-based organizations, government agencies and elected officials) with a focus on those representing customers Energy Trust has previously underserved (communities of color, Spanish speaking customers, customers with low incomes and rural communities)
- A key focus of our advertising is to deliver messaging, strategies and creative materials that advance diversity, equity and inclusion objectives for program awareness and participation and to engage customers who we have not successfully served, including supporting collaborations with community-based organizations, highlighting community voices and expanding program reach and participation in culturally and economically diverse and rural areas.
- Energy Trust uses a contractor specialized in media buying to provide these services on our behalf. The media buyer's role is to identify and purchase advertising space on channels that are relevant to our target audiences at the optimal time, for the least amount of money. By partnering with a firm that has deep knowledge of markets and media channels in our service territory, we can achieve maximum exposure among our target markets for the least amount of spend. This has become particularly important in the last few years as Energy Trust has increased targeting to populations we have underserved, requiring increased sophistication in media planning and the development of new relationships with channels we have not used in the past. Grady Britton is Energy Trust's current media buying partner and has been providing these services for the last two years.

Background: Media Buying and Creative Marketing Services RFQ

A Request for Qualifications (RFQ) for media buying and creative marketing service was issued by Energy Trust in September 2022. The RFQ was developed by staff to identify expertise in two main areas of work. The first is media buying to place advertising across the state, with particular focus on rural areas, communities of color, low-income customers and Spanish-speaking customers and, upon identification of qualified media buying service providers, enter into contract(s) for those services. The second is creative marketing services in support of Energy Trust's brand marketing activities. The primary objective of the services sought is to raise awareness of Energy Trust as an organization with relevant offers and benefits and motivate customers to act, particularly among rural communities, communities of color, Spanish-speaking customers and low-income customers.

- The RFQ included supplier diversity criteria that required bidders to describe their approach to diversity, equity and inclusion, including:
 - o Experience in integrating diversity, equity, and inclusion internally in their firm, both in staffing and in contracting for services.
 - o Efforts and experience in teaming with minority- and women-owned firms
 - o Approach to ensuring representation in the design and execution of multicultural strategies, including experience in transcreating campaigns or marketing materials for culturally specific audiences.
 - Identification as Certification Office for Business Inclusion and Diversity (COBID)-listed and/or woman- or minority-owned or inclusion of a subcontracting plan that allocates a minimum of 20% of the contract budget to COBID-listed and/or woman-or minority-owned firms.

- The RFQ was announced via the Energy Trust website and an email to a list of potential contractors compiled from the Contracting Opportunities interest form on our website, a survey of COBID-listed marketing firms on the State of Oregon's database and other parties identified by staff in a survey of the market.
- Proposals were due October 19, 2022, and Energy Trust received six responses.
- A five person RFQ selection committee comprised of staff from the Communications and Customer Service group, the Energy Programs marketing team and a non-staff representative from the Diversity Advisory Council reviewed the proposals. The review team:
 - Reviewed the proposals against the RFQ criteria for approach to work, relevant experience, reasonable cost, commitment to DEI, team experience and location, reporting and overall demonstration of quality
 - Provided preliminary scores based on the written proposals and narrowed the pool to two bidders to interview
 - Posed questions to bidders to address in the interviews
 - Interviewed both bidders
 - Participated in follow-up discussions and updated scoring
 - Made a recommendation for the selection

Discussion: Scoring, Interviews and Selection

Six responses were received from firms qualified to provide media buying and creative services to Energy Trust. Detailed information about the six responses was presented to and discussed with the Finance & Audit Committee on December 5, 2022. Committee members asked staff questions regarding the selection process. Responses were evaluated using the criteria shown in Table 1.

Grady Britton's weighted score across all categories was the highest. Staff asked Grady Britton and the next most highly scored firm in for in-person interviews. Following the interviews, staff selected Grady Britton to recommend to the board for contracting.

Interviews and Winner Selection

The RFQ selection committee invited Grady Britton and another finalist to attend one-hour virtual interviews in the first week of November 2022. The purpose of the interviews was to meet each team, hear their personalized pitch to provide media buying and creative marketing services, ask additional questions about their firm's experience or information that was missing from the written responses and engage in open discussion with the team about any other elements of the proposed working relationship. Following the interviews, the RFQ committee convened to discuss the finalists and select a winner by consensus.

While both firms delivered professional presentations, the selection committee felt that Grady Britton's presentation, responses, and experience were most aligned with Energy Trust's needs.

Both firms were given an estimated one-year budget of "roughly \$1.6 million" and asked to demonstrate how they would use it to accomplish the work needed. They were also told that approximately \$200,000 of the total budget would be allocated to creative services with the rest going to media buying.

Grady Britton proposed a simple commission fee structure for media buying which would have a relatively small portion of the media buying budget for internal costs with the remainder passing through to local media outlets.

Grady Britton provided a comprehensive and balanced pitch that emphasized their strong track record of success over the last two years in delivering these services for Energy Trust. Their approach to the work emphasized a strategy of developing media strategy and creative messaging closely together to maximize reach and engagement with underrepresented communities that Energy Trust has not yet reached.

2023 Scope and Budget

Energy Trust's advertising budget continues to be just under one percent of the
annual organization budget which is lower than average, based on business and
marketing industry research. The budget allocated for advertising each year is
determined through the annual planning and budget process, which establishes our
organizational goals and our savings and generation targets for the year. The two
year budget for this media buying and creative marketing services contract will be
\$3,078,000 million.

Of the total 2023 budget, \$360,680 will be retained by Grady Britton to cover the
costs of their services. The remaining \$1,178,320 will be paid by Grady Britton
directly to media outlets and other channel providers around the state on Energy
Trust's behalf and according to a media buying plan developed with approval by
staff. The two-year total for Grady Britton services would be \$721,360, with
\$2,356,640 passing through to local media outlets.

Recommendation

 Authorize Executive Director to sign Media Buying and Creative Marketing Services with Grady Britton for a two-year term, beginning January 1, 2023, with potential for an additional one-year extension recommended upon performance satisfaction and approval by the Board.

RESOLUTION 993

AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR TO EXECUTE A CONTRACT WITH GRADY BRITTON, INC. FOR CREATIVE MARKETING AND ADVERTISING PURCHASES SERVICES

WHEREAS:

- 1. Creative marketing services and advertising buying at Energy Trust allows programs to reach all customers in the service territory across a diverse set of media, including print, radio, TV, outdoor and online, creating awareness, and promoting services and programs.
- 2. There is a clear connection between creative marketing and advertising to reach and support customer awareness and engagement, leading to savings and generation;
- 3. Creative marketing consulting and deliverables supports Energy Trust's customer engagement to lead to savings and generation;
- Increased advertising reach, using a professional media buyer with constant media contact and significant media data, allows Energy Trust to expand customer participation by increasing the number of times people see our message;
- 5. Using a professional media buyer allows Energy Trust to take advantage of added-value that works in collaboration with PR goals and promotes Energy Trust across mediums;
- 6. Staff recommends entering into a contract for creative marketing and advertising purchases services with Grady Britton, Inc. and presented information supporting this recommendation to the Energy Trust Board of Directors Finance & Audit Committee on December 5, 2023; and
- 7. The Finance & Audit Committee recommends that the board approve staff's recommendation consistent with the resolution below.

It is therefore RESOLVED, that the board of directors of Energy Trust of Oregon, Inc. authorizes the executive director to:

- Execute a two-year contract with Grady Britton for creative marketing services and advertising purchasing services with terms and conditions that include, but are not limited to, the following:
 - Authorizing payments of up to \$3.078 million, and consistent with Energy Trust's board-approved budgets, for the purchase and reporting of broadcast radio, TV, print and online media on behalf of Energy Trust over the term of the contract, which includes up to \$721,360 of the total authorized contract amount payable to Grady Britton for Energy Trust advertising purchasing services and payable to Grady Britton under contract terms and conditions:
 - o Providing for a possible one-year extension of the contract, subject to achievement of express performance metrics and board approval; and
 - Requiring Grady Britton coordination with Energy Trust to support Energy Trust's advertising objectives for increased customer awareness; and
 - o Any other terms and conditions to ensure Grady Britton services and media purchases are designed and executed to further Energy Trust's advertising strategy.

Purpose Statement:

The Board Diversity, Equity and Inclusion Committee (the "DEI Committee") is an ad hoc committee of the Energy Trust of Oregon (the "ETO") Board of Directors (the "Board") whose function and workplan will be completed by December 31, 2023, its date of dissolution. The DEI Committee will make recommendations to the Board on the below described specific actions to improve and develop the Board's intercultural competency, its diversity, equity, inclusion and effectiveness in supporting and leading implementation of the 2020-2024 Strategic Plan, the ETO Diversity, Equity and Inclusion (DEI) Policy and the ETO DEI Operations Plan. In formulating its recommendations to the Board and Board Committees, the DEI Committee will consult with and seek the advice of the Diversity Advisory Committee.

Responsibilities:

Nature and Scope of ad hoc DEI Committee Activities

- Recommend for Board adoption a foundational statement defining the nature, scope and application of Board Diversity, Equity and Inclusion ("DEI") activities.
- Develop a 2022 Board ad hoc DEI Committee Workplan consistent with the Responsibilities and timeline set forth in this Charter document.
- Develop a 2023 Board ad hoc DEI Committee Workplan consistent with the Responsibilities and timeline set forth in this Charter document.

DEI Discussions, Interactions and Activities

Recommend for Board adoption and implementation:

- Standards for open and candid discussion of DEI related matters that foster respect for various points of view.
- A procedure for addressing conflict that may arise relating to DEI issues.
- A process to acknowledge and implement ETO's DEI goals and commitments.
- A program for Board DEI training that includes consideration of the nature and scope of DEI consulting and training services as well as guest speakers.

- Collaboratively form recommendations to the ETO Board

- Participate in Committee meetings and deliberations
- Use personal and professional experience and materials to support Committee decision making
- Collaboratively form recommendations to the Board Act as liaisons to the ETO Diversity Equity and Inclusion Advisory Committee (DAC)

Progress and/or Success Indicators:

1. Welcome

Angie Thomson, consultant at Thomson Strategic Consulting, convened the meeting at 10:00 a.m. on Zoom and in-person. The agenda, notes and presentation materials are available on Energy Trust's website at www.energytrust.org/about/public-meetings/. Thomson established meeting norms and foundations of engagement: challenge the idea, not the person; take space and make space; listen actively and participate constructively; and impact outweighs intent. Advisory councils added centering race in conversations, expecting and accepting non-closure, being willing to do things differently and being open minded.

2. Draft Organizational Goals Presentation and Discussion

Topic summary

Michael Colgrove, executive director at Energy Trust, presented the draft 2023 Organizational Goals. Colgrove shared the feedback that shaped the understanding of market dynamics and how staff incorporated that feedback into the draft budget. The feedback led to the customization of programs to meet the specific needs of customers the organization has underserved in the past, including small businesses, Black and Indigenous communities, communities of color, people experiencing low incomes and rural communities. Colgrove also highlighted the draft 2023-2024 Action Plan and demonstrated how staff incorporated council feedback into action plans.

Discussion

Council members asked how dialogue starts with community-based organizations regarding how Energy Trust's programs can be of use to them (Brikky King). Staff emphasized the myriad of ways engagement takes place, starting with initial conversations and information sharing with outreach staff. Additionally, Energy Trust's Working Together Grants have proven useful in establishing new relationships with some organizations and further developing others. Energy Trust's diversity, equity and inclusion (DEI) lead, Tyrone Henry; Residential staff; energy programs director, Tracy Scott; and the Communities and New Initiatives Sector provide other points of entry (Michael Colgrove). Staff mentioned collaborations with ethnic chambers, National Association of Minority Contractors, LatinoBuilt and Professional Business Development Group.

Council members asked for specific practices Energy Trust has in place to prevent future harm (Huong Tran). Staff stated that even as the organization continues to diversify its staff and partnerships, it will not be possible to prevent future harm. Instead, it will focus on healing after recognizing and addressing harm caused.

Council members asked about accountability measures (Terrance Harris). Staff replied that accountability measures can be found in the DEI Plan and that the DEI Committee is planning four community engagements to receive feedback on the metrics, after which they will be finalized (Michael Colgrove). In addition, the Oregon Public Utility Commission (OPUC) is defining an inaugural set of equity performance measures for Energy Trust by year-end that the organization will be responsive to.

Council members recognized the positive strides in equity that the organization has made over the last few years, particularly in reaching communities it has historically underserved. Members then asked for plans to diversify the staff (Kheoshi Owens). Staff replied that annual goals highlight new activities exclusively. Energy Trust has taken multiple steps to improve the diversity of its staff, such as by having a DAC member on all hiring panels, expanding outreach for recruitment and better balancing credentials with skills and experience (Michael Colgrove).

Council members asked if there were methods to track outreach success (Raphaela Hsu Flanders). Staff replied that the metrics, which the DEI Committee is developing, will be published in the DEI Plan (Michael Colgrove).

Council members applauded the feedback implementation and the important technical assistance role that Energy Trust plays. Members continued, expressing the pressing need for deep, tailored financial assistance to serve different communities across the state and the desire to see this outlined in the budget (Alexia Kelly). Staff cited regulations regarding the use of ratepayer funds restricts Energy Trust's efforts to certain objectives. However, the Innovation and Development Team will enhance Energy Trust's ability to support new objectives and collaborate more deeply with other organizations to achieve aligned goals (Michael Colgrove). Staff further stated the collaborative efforts with utility partners and the Contracting Alliance for Diversity and Equity will create new opportunities (Tyrone Henry).

Council members asked if Energy Trust is working on developing measures or strategies with benefits that go directly to renters instead of property owners (Jaimes Valdez). Staff stated that this challenge is long standing and pervasive across the country and Energy Trust is in conversation with the OPUC regarding ways to provide benefit to renters. Options are installing equipment at little or no cost to the property owner and establishing laws that require efficient appliances in all multifamily buildings. However, some of these options may lead to increased rents (Michael Colgrove). Council members noted that Oregon State Senate Bill 1536 directs the Oregon Department of Energy to provide up to 60% of costs for heat pumps for renters (Christy Splitt).

Council members asked how targets for average annual megawatts compare to previous years (Jaimes Valdez). Staff directed members to the budget materials. Draft savings goals for 2023 are on par with 2022 goals because economic conditions are expected to remain the same. Demand for many clean energy upgrades continues to exceed the availability of equipment and installers (Michael Colgrove).

Council members asked how the DEI Plan relates to the strategic plan, stressing the importance of explicitly including DEI in the strategic plan or instead creating a DEI Strategic Plan (Kheoshi Owens, Terrance Harris). Others thought that the strategic and operational plans are different and should remain separate; however, the role of DEI in the strategic plan should be further explained. Additionally, council members thought that, given the volatile environment in which Energy Trust operates, it should consider a 3-year strategic plan instead of a 5-year strategic plan (Jeff Bissonnette). Staff stated that the strategic plan captures organizational vision and is on a five-year cycle, and the DEI Plan is a "living document" that will be continually updated. While a commitment to DEI is mentioned in the strategic plan, staff will review how it is represented (Michael Colgrove).

Staff reviewed the next steps in the budget process, inviting council members to provide comments until October 25. Their feedback will be shared with the Board Finance and Audit Committee and reflected in the final proposed budget. Council liaisons may provide an update on the status of the budget during the November advisory council meetings if substantial changes are recommended (Michael Colgrove).

Council members commented on missing the full presentation on the entire budget, stating that it is inadequate to provide feedback at this stage without the full budget and after the public comment period closed. Additionally, council members stressed the importance of increased collaboration with community members and organizations.

Lastly, staff recognized Kheoshi Owens for her service as a founding DAC member who was instrumental in developing the Council. Energy Trust will continue to work with her in other capacities. Michael Colgrove and Betsy Kauffman, renewables sector lead, both expressed appreciation for how she personally helped them grow.

Next steps

Organizational goals will be published in the final proposed 2023 budget and action plan presented to the board of directors for approval on December 16. Process and timing feedback will be shared internally to inform next year's budget and action plan schedule.

3. Adjourn

The meeting adjourned at 11:27 a.m. The next meetings are November 15 for the Diversity Advisory Council and November 16 for the Renewable Energy Advisory Council and Conservation Advisory Council.
